Welcome To The Mediterranean As It Once Was!

Croatia extends from the furthest eastern edges of the Alps in the north-west to the Pannonian lowlands and the banks of the Danube in the east; its central region is covered by the Dinara mountain range, and its southern parts extend to the coast of the Adriatic Sea.

The mainland covers 56,542 km², and the surface of the territorial sea is 31,067 km².

Population is 4,437,460 inhabitants, and the capital city Zagreb has 779,145 inhabitants. Zagreb is also the economic, traffic, cultural and academic centre of the country.

There are two climate zones; a temperate continental climate, locally also a mountainous climate, prevails in the interior, whereas a pleasant Mediterranean climate prevails along the Adriatic coast, with an overwhelming number of sunny days, dry and hot summers, mild and humid winters.

Croatia is indeed unique, not only for its crystal clear, clean blue sea, but also for a thousand years of different cultures that have replaced each other and sometimes assimilated in these areas. The Adriatic Sea is not only a deep gulf in the Mediterranean cut into the Continent of Europe thereby creating a most economical trade route between Europe and the East; it is also the cradle of ancient civilizations. There is much material evidence which is finally beginning to come to light, from the depths of Adriatic caves and from the deep blue sea. The east coast of the Adriatic Sea was inhabited as early as the beginning of the early Stone Age, and there is proof that most of the accessible islands were also inhabited.

Walking tour through the park of 16 lakes which are connected to 92 cascades and waterfalls. This park is more than 4000 years old, is

considered a unique phenomenon, and was put on the list of UNESCO's list of World Natural Heritage. Plitvice lakes in the winter time are covered with snow, and falls and some of the lakes are frozen. As you walk through the park you will note an unusual silence - it is known as frozen rhapsody.

Restaurant "Lička kuća" was built in 1972 in a traditional style typical for the Lika county and with the idea of offering exclusively traditional regional dishes. The restaurant underwent a complete refurbishment in 2003 and now consists of two floors with a total capacity of 270 seats in the main hall and 32 seats on the terrace. The first floor is divided into different sections, each representing different villages from Lika region, filled with the typical folk items that belonged to their ancestors.

In the centre of the ground floor there is an open wood-burning stove for spit-roasted lamb and different authentic dishes such as veal and potatoes baked under a clay bell.

Our guests are offered outstanding local dishes, made with exclusively homemade products and following traditional recipes. "Pršut" (smoked ham), "basa" (a dip like dish, made of fermented milk), "lička juha" (lamb soup with vegetables), different kinds of meat and potatoes baked under a clay bell, grilled meats, "police" (baked potato halves) trout from the local rivers, and deserts such as doughnuts, apple, plum or cheese strudel are just some of the delicacies offered at this excellent restaurant.

Opatija is situated in the Gulf of Kvarner in a sheltered position at the foot of Učka mountain. The city's most prestigious sight is the Villa Angiolina, which was built in 1844 by Iginio Scarpa, a rich merchant from Rijeka. There is a 12 km-long promenade along the entire riviera, the Lungomare from Volosko, via Opatija, to Lovran.

Kastel and town walls, Motovun gives a true image of past times when it was built as a medieval fortification.

This is a city with a wonderful history. You can find museums, galleries which are in the most important city palaces, many of them are the homes for people as they have been centuries ago. Besides Basilica, now it is possible to visit Euphrasius' bishopric, opened in the year 2000 as an architectural monument and the church museum.

Rovinj is located on the western coast of the Istrian peninsula, This is a popular tourist resort and an active fishing port. It is also often considered one of the most beautiful towns on the Adriatic coast. You will visit the church of Saint Eufemia. Rovinj is also famous for the archipelago which consists of 19 islands.

The largest city in Istria is Pula, whose origins predate the era of the Roman colonies. The city has a long tradition of winemaking, fishing, shipbuilding, and tourism. You will visit a famous amphitheater, built in the first century during the reign of Emperor Vespasian, which accommodates more than 20,000 people. The Temple of Augustus and the Triumph Arch of Sergians, also from the first century, are kept in excellent condition.

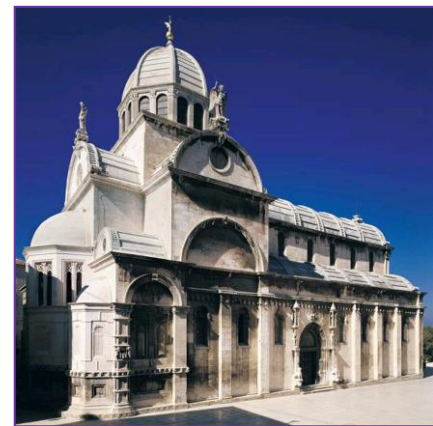

Šibenik, a gem in the Croatian Adriatic, is situated along the mouth of Krka on the most picturesque part of the eastern Adriatic coast. As the oldest Croatian town it was first mentioned in 1066 during the reign of the Croatian King Kresimir IV. The rich cultural and historical heritage of the city is visible in the impressive Cathedral of sv. Jakov [St. Jacob], built by the famous architect Juraj Dalmatinac and is under UNESCO protection.

Numerous churches, monasteries, palaces and four fortresses 'frame' the city, and also testify to the perseverance, renunciation and faith of generations of people of Šibenik. Šibenik is a city of culture, the host to the only International Children's Festival as well as traditional events such as Dalmatian chanson Evenings.

The tour starts with sightseeing of the Palace of the Emperor Diocletian which is the heart and soul of Split, built in 295 BC, but still a living monument. In the magnificent palace you will see 4 gates; the most famous is the Golden gate and in front of it, you will see the statue of Grgur Ninski made by Ivan Meštrović; square Peristil where the Emperor's speeches took place, the mausoleum of the Roman Emperor which was transformed in Catholic church, today called the Cathedral of St. Dominus with famous bell tower; streets Cardo and Decumanus... After visiting the palace, immediately outside you will see many charming "piazzas". At the end of the city tour we will take you to the Riva, a coastal walk with palm trees where you can relax in the sun and enjoy the beautiful view of the port and near-by islands.

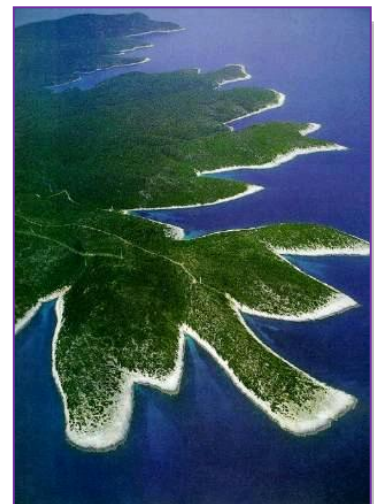

Hvar belongs to the central island group of the Adriatic and lies in an east-west direction at right angles to the coast. These islands together are called "The Hvar Group". The eastern promontory of Hvar is only 4,5 km away from the mainland, while the western one faces the open sea. "Lower Hvar", the western part, is called the "head of the island", as its main area. Plume – the eastern part – gets narrow towards "the top". Hvar (68 km long) is also the fourth largest in area (300 sq.m.)

Ston is a village and municipality in the Dubrovnik – Neretva County of Croatia, located at the south of isthmus of the Pelješac peninsula. Ston was a major fort of the Ragusan Republic whose defensive walls were regarded as a notable feat of medieval architecture.

Dubrovnik is rich in cultural and historical monuments and is included in UNESCO World Heritage List. The most recognizable feature which defines the History of Dubrovnik and gives it its characteristic are its intact city walls which run uninterrupted for 1940 meters encircling the city. This complex structure, one of the most beautiful and strongest systems in the Europe is the main attraction of this city.

*Kotor, Located along one of **Montenegro's** most beautiful bays is Kotor, a city of traders and famous sailors, with many stories to tell. Medieval architecture and numerous monuments of cultural heritage have made Kotor an UNESCO listed "World Natural and Historical Heritage Site". Through the entire city the buildings are criss-crossed with narrow streets and squares. You will see St. Tryphon cathedral.*

Hvar, with its seven century-old walls and fortifications, is the site of the oldest municipal [theatre](#) in [Europe](#), opened in [1612](#). The town also has many galleries, museums, and exhibitions, including Arsenal, Lođa, Zvijezda Mora, Anuncijata, Skorpion, and the Croatian Institute, which hold numerous art collections.

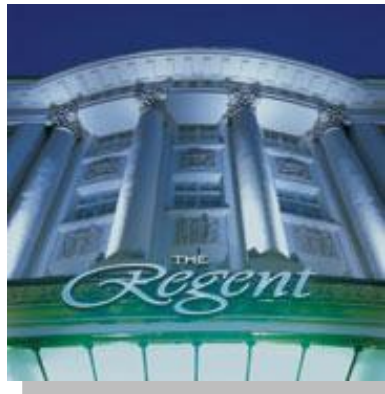
